OBJETIVES

The aim of the Master's Degree is the academic and scientific preparation of specialists in the History and Anthropology of America. Its objectives include the training of professionals who demonstrate originality, creativity and analytical rigour in the understanding of the history and anthropology of American societies, in the disciplines of history, archaeology, ethnohistory and ethnology; through the study of culture, society and politics from different perspectives, approaches, theories, times and spaces.

PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS

The Master's Degree is aimed at university graduates interested in becoming specialists in American History and Anthropology, who wish to take part in contemporary scientific debates, and who wish to be trained in the analysis and intervention in American socio-political and cultural problems, giving special relevance to the study of social and cultural diversity. Most of the lectures are given in Spanish.

WHY STUDY THIS MASTER'S DEGREE?

- Because UCM offers the highest concentration of specialised Americanist professors in Europe.
- Because this Master's degree with a double specialisation in American History and Anthropology is unique Master's Degree e in Spain and Europe.

- Because Madrid is home to numerous archives, museums, libraries, and cultural and scientific institutions whose resources for Americanist research are of worldwide importance.

STRUCTURE

The syllabus consists of 60 structured ECTS:

- Fundamental Module: 24 compulsory ECTS
- Specialisation Module: 24 optional ECTS (12 optional and 12 compulsory)
- External Internships: 6 elective ECTS
- Master's Final Project: 12 compulsory ECTS

Students must take: 4 compulsory subjects, between 4 and 7 optional subjects and the Final Master's Thesis.

The Degree is structured in two itineraries: History of America and Anthropology of America, which share the Fundamental Module and the Master's Thesis. In order to complete one of the two pathways, students must take 12 ECTS and 12 elective ECTS of the chosen pathway. However, students who do not wish to specialise in one of the two pathways may take the subjects of each pathway without receiving a specialisation mention.
